

This year more than one hundred students between ages 10 and 15 have participated in Nobel in Rinkeby and Tensta. They have spent the autumn engaged in creative projects rooted in their local communities, as well as literature, scientific discoveries, and role models from around the world.

It started in 1988 when cultural studies researcher Elly Berg and author Gunilla Lundgren collaborated with Arabic-speaking children and their mother-tongue teachers to create a booklet for Naguib Mahfouz, Nobel laureate in Literature. Since then, children and young people in Rinkeby have worked with the Nobel Prize by writing and illustrating a multilingual booklet for the year's laureate. They also create a diorama that is displayed at Rinkeby library. Since 2019, students from Tensta are also involved. New students and teachers participate every year.

This year, students from Enbacksskolan in Tensta and Askebyskolan in Rinkeby have studied the life of Alfred Nobel, the Nobel Prize, this year's laureates, and especially the Nobel laureate in Literature, Han Kang. We have read excerpts from Han Kang's *Human Acts*, *The White Book*, *I Do Not Bid Farewell*, and *The Fruit of My Woman*. The texts have elicited many feelings and thoughts, which were then used as the basis for creative works under the leadership of authors and illustrators and in close contact with teachers and school librarians. Parts of the project have been photo documented by students from Anna Whitlock's Upper Secondary School.



In December, we conclude our work by inviting the Nobel laureate to Rinkeby library. The children present their work on stage and hand over their booklet to the laureate. Afterwards the children serve tea and oriental pastries, and have the opportunity to talk to the laureate.

Several Nobel laureates have said that meeting the children and young adults has been one of the best parts of Nobel week. "I felt at home, 'in the right place", Annie Ernaux wrote in the guestbook after her visit to Rinkeby in 2022.
